This subject appears to be quite a hot spot and a confusing issue for some. Unfortunately a lot of Christians in Messiah Yeshua (Jesus) have been under the assumption that the land of Israel will be inherited by all believers. A Memorial to embrace

Inspirational Reading

In this month we share on our annual feast called Pesach (a). Pesach or Passover in English is a time when most observant Jewish persons (b) and Jewish believers celebrate in memorial what is written within Sh'mot-Exodus (c). But is there a difference in the way Pesach is done between a Jewish believer and Jewish non-believer? Actually there is. First of all we who believe in Messiah Yeshua (Jesus) celebrate in memorial what he has done for us by becoming G-ds Passover lamb sacrifice which was given to us for the forgiveness and justification for all of our sins. Jewish non-believers do not hold to this truth yet. In fact observant Jewish persons are still holding to the Passover from the Egyptian slavery as found in the book of sh'mot. However Passover for some observant Jewish persons is nothing more than holding to rabbinic traditions since the days of the destruction of the second temple (d1-d2). So, there are big differences as to how both celebrate the Passover. Only when we grab hold of the B'rit ha dash (NC) does the concept of a Messiah becoming a Passover lamb fulfills G-ds requirement for justification from mans sins. In the Old Testament era a proper or kosher way of keeping Passover according to the Torah was to have the Priest and the Temple. With no priest or temple to bless the sacrifice it really is unkoshered (e). Today some Jewish people (f) try to honor the Torah by sacrificing lambs on Pesach. The problem here again is that their sacrifice is invalid.....
