"Tradition and Pesach"

During the Hebrew month of Nisan (April) we celebrate our annual Holiday called Pe'sach (Passover). Over the years the celebration of the Pesach has transformed itself among rabbinic Judaism. (e.i) During the days of Moshe and found

Within the Torah ^(a) we see that when the Passover was first instituted it only contained three food elements ^(b). Those elements were the standard practice for the proper Passover. Now as time would have it the main elements were added to. This reason being today that the Jewish sacrificial system is no longer in play. Therefore the whole proper act of keeping the Passover is nothing more than rabbinic observance to what the Torah calls the biblical Passover. Today things like a be'tzu (egg) or Haroset (sweet sauce) or even lots of added glasses of wine (whoop-pee!) they may think, changed the way the original Passover was celebrated. The facts are that the Torah quite clearly said that there was only three main ingredients which one should have been concerned with ^(c). But because of the destruction of the 1st century Jewish temple in 70A.D the Rabbi's of this time period and later decided and opted to a newer upgraded version of our biblical Passover. But yet some need to understand that the Passover today was NOT the one Yeshua (Jesus) celebrated. Ergo we have our modern Jewish tradition of the Passover. I must say that it is hardly like the original. Keeping Passover today from a rabbinic tradition is exactly that, a tradition. One could hardly and properly keep it right without the temple and its priest. However some among Judaism today still zealously try and keep it by even killing the lamb.
