MIDRASH WITH THE RABBI-Knowledge for the believer

What did Ya'akov (Jacob) see?

In the Torah (1) we read that the Hebrew patriarch Ya'akov (2) laid his head upon a rock for a pillow and then had a dream. The dream revealed a ladder reaching heaven to earth with angels ascending and descending upon it, and at the top of the ladder stood Yah'veh Elo'him translated in the English as (the Lord G-d). But why did Yah'veh reveal this dream? As most should know that the dream was first given to Ya'akov as a comfort (3) and second for a confirmation to the former promises, and covenant which was made with his father, and grandfather (4). G-d finally assures Ya'akov of his protection and faithful unconditional covenant (5). The full meaning of this dream is also expanded in the B'rit hadasha (6). Here Nathanael the Israelite seeks G-d for revelation by meditating on (Gen.28:12) up in a tree. To be up in a tree which was (symbolic of a ladder) was said to be a place which makes one closer to G-d or heaven. Climbing up a tree to study scripture was also said to be a way in which one could

In this month we share on an issue that most believers face at one time or another in their lives. What we all have faced is a time where we find ourselves in a place that seems right to us, but yet it is not spiritually good for our futures. It may be a job, a church, a relationship or family matter. In all such cases we find that we are challenged to make a decision in order to make our lives a bit more peasant or tolerable. Unfortunately we may experience fear or have great fears about what might occur when we make those decisions. Some may choose to do absolutely nothing, while others decide on the wrong direction or compromise to keep up with the crowd. In the mish'lei (proverbs)(a) we see that G-ds word is stable when it comes to situations such as these. The scripture relates that one should never lean upon their own Se'hel (understanding). The Hebrew here means that we are never to trust in our own intellect, nor are we to count upon our own judgment in directing ourselves unto good paths. NO" the teaching of the mish'lei (proverbs) is very firm when it says, "acknowledge HIM, and HE shall direct your paths" (b). Things may seem right, look good but they may not be what G-d wants for our lives. With a little courage and faith to turn to G-d we can receive an answer. This answer may not be what we may have been expecting to hear, but rest assure the answer we get is exactly what we need in order to go on for the future. If you find yourself in a place where you are being challenged to move forward, don't draw back as the scripture says (c)
