## From Sadness to Gladness

Shalom chaver, (friends).

This is the month that we celebrate the rest of the fall feast. The first out of two feasts this month is Yom Kippur (the Day of Atonement) Thurs Oct 9<sup>th</sup> 2008. It is not really a feast which focuses on joy, but is a time to pray, fast, reflect and deal with sin. On this day many Jewish people who observe G-ds word fast (Lev 23:27-32) and pray hoping to be forgiven for another New Year. As we learned about Rosh ha Shannah it is said that the books of life, death, and in between are open. But on Yom Kippur they are defiantly closed until another year arrives. Yom Kippur teaches us that all are sinful and need forgiveness (Rom 3:10). It also shows us the importance of the need for a sacrifice which is needed to forgive sins (Lev 17:11). This provision is crystal clear in the B'rit ha dasha (New Covenant) -1Yonahan-1John 2:2- 4:10. The New covenant tells us that Yeshua (Jesus) became that one time offering of atonement for sin (Heb 7:27). Through him we now have a permanent justification or that is complete forgiveness from sin. But unfortunately some Jewish people today believe that shedding chicken's blood is just as good and use it to sprinkle over themselves on this day of atonement. I don't image the scriptures said "behold the chicken G-d who takes away the sin of the world"! Never the less we have the true sacrifice of G-d who does indeed remove all our sins from us (Col 2:13-14). On Yom Kippur we remember the messiah's great sacrifice upon the crucifixion tree. We also search in our hearts and repent for any ungodliness that causes us to stumble. We can do this daily, but Yom Kippur is a literal reminder to check one's life and to make all things right with G-d, and others. The future picture of yom Kippur also sees the final day when Israel the nation will one day be cleansed from all its sin when messiah returns at the second coming. When G-ds people are finally cleansed from sin then true blessing can be restored, which is the next event that follows Yom Kippur. Five days later the feast of Sukkot (Tabernacles) happens (Lev 23:34). This is the last feast on the Hebrew calendar until the spring season. Sukkot is a time of Joy, gladness and harvest (Lev 23:40-43). We also build small huts (Neh 8:14) called sukkah's and live in them during this 7 day feast plus one (8<sup>th</sup> day). Sukkot is reminder of the wilderness wonders and how G-d protected, provided and guided our people when he led them out of Egypt. The season is also agricultural and centers on the gathering harvest of the land of Israel also representing the regathering of the Jewish people. A future picture of Sukkot also represents the establishment of the messianic kingdom era. This day along with others will be celebrated globally (Zech 14: 16-19). ## Monthly Hebraic Study

This Month's Hebrew word is:

**הַגּ Hag-(festival)**

**Which definition means:** festival, gathering, festival sacrifice, pilgrim-feast, celebration, and an occasion, day or season for joyfulness

**(Joh 7:37-39) Now on the last day of the great hag (festival), called Hoshi'anna Raba (please save us), Yeshua cried out, saying, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. 38 He who believes in me, as the Kit'vei Ha kodesh (Holy scripture) said, 'Out of the midst of him, rivers of MAYIM CHAYYIM (living waters) will flow. 39 Now this he spoke concerning the Ruach Ha kodesh (Holy Spirit) which those who believed in him were about to receive, for the Ruach Ha kodesh had not yet been given, because Yeshua (Jesus) he had not yet been kavod (glorified).**

The last day of the Hag (festival) here called "Hoshi'anna raba" was the 7<sup>th</sup> day of the feast of Sukkot (tabernacles). Some commentators have supposed and have confused the day with the eight day rest of Sukkot. But according to Jewish tradition the outpouring ceremony called (simhat bet ha sho-evah) of the water upon the altar happened on the last seventh day of Sukkot. It is also on this day traditionally where our Jewish people cried out Hoshi'anna Raba (please save us!) in the hopes that Messiah would come, save, pour out his spirit, and restore the Jewish people, the kingdom, and to make Israel a great nation among the nations once again. But all of this could not happen without first acceptance of the King Messiah. On this very last day the Messiah did appear and did announce his Messiahship, but was rejected (Verse 40-43). However to those who did believe upon him would be revived and restored by the promise of the out pouring of the Ruach ha Kadosh (Holy Spirit) (Acts 2:4). In the future the Jewish nation will have another shot at acceptance of the Messiah (Matt 23:29). And at that point the fulfillment of Sukkot will come to pass and the Messianic kingdom which is liken to a fallen sukkah some times referred to as the fallen tabernacle of David will be restored (Amos 9:11). Until then we who believe today look forward to the Hag (festival) with eager joy for the days of the Messiah which are yet to return (scripture refs;

### What's the Millennial all about?

The Millennial Kingdom is something that every believer in the Messiah longs, Hopes and waits for. It's a time in which the full earthly reign of the Messiah will occur (Dan 7:14). But what really does the word Millennium mean? Well, the word Millennium simply means: a period of 1000 years. *The millennium, the period of a thousand years during which Messiah will reign on earth (Rev. 20:1-7), a period of general righteousness and happiness, esp. in the indefinite future, a thousandth anniversary.* Has this Millennium happened yet? Absolutely NOT! How do we really know that it hasn't occurred? For starters one thing that happens is that the Messiah is once again here upon the earth. Second there will be a worldwide regathering of the Jewish people, not like today where our Jewish people are making aliyah to Israel. They are going to Israel today in rejection and in unbelief that Yeshua is the Messiah (this promotes future judgment). But during the millennium the Jewish people are being brought back because they have accepted the reigning King Messiah (Ezek 28:25). So the regathering now is not worldwide but is partial. What others details will happen in the millennium? The Davidic or Messianic Kingdom will be restored back to the Jewish nation. Isn't it already there? Absolutely NOT! Because the return of the Messiah has not yet come. Without him there is no kingdom! Also during the millennial kingdom the Messiah will build up the Bet ha mikdash (Holy Temple of G-d). But isn't that

built up by the Jewish people during the time of Ya'akovs trouble (trib period)? Or isn't that the church today? There will be a Jewish temple in the 7 year trib but its destroyed during the 3 ½ year period (Matt 24:15). So the Temple that Messiah will build is from scratch on up (Zech 6:12-13). And he does this during his 1,000 yr reign. As far as we know this is completely future and has not yet occurred. The Ezekiel temple also is NOT today's church because the millennial temple of the Messiah is not spiritual, but is a physical temple where he will serve, govern, and conduct his ministry affairs (Isa 9:6). Another major issue is dealing with the wicked and sinful. During the millennium the Messiah will judge the sheep nations and the goat nations (Matt 25:32-34). He will purge the world from evil as the evil one himself is cast into the bottomless pit for the 1,000 yrs (Rev 20:1-3) (HOO'RAY LORD!!) which brings true peace in the earth and harmony during his reign. ### Iran 2-5 years from bomb OCTOBER 2008

Iran is two years to five years away from being able to produce a nuclear weapon, the former head of the U.S. weapons-hunting team in Iraq said Wednesday. But David Kay said the U.S. should not consider bombing Iranian nuclear facilities unless the weapon was about to be transferred to a terrorist group. Kay, who led the Iraq Survey Group from 2003 until early 2004, said the U.S. should line up international support to pressure Iran to give up on a nuclear weapon, while also preparing for the strong possibility that effort will fail. Preparations could include offering security guarantees to Iran's neighbors and shoring up Middle East stability and economic growth. Iran is 80 percent of the way to a nuclear weapon, Kay estimates, but the last 20 percent of development is the most difficult. He noted that Iran has worked on the program for 20 years without successfully producing a weapon. You've got a clear record of country that is damned determined at some point to develop nuclear weapons," Kay said in a talk at the Nixon Center. "The real question to ask is, 'What are the political strategies we can follow now that can lessen the impact?' of a nuclear Iran." (Click for more
